ABC SUMMARY



Summarizing requires students to distill information in a concise, synthesized form and focus on the important points presented in a text (Marzano, 2001). This strategy involves students sharing the responsibility for summarizing content through the creation of an ABC list of learning.



Materials: video segment, blank paper or chart paper, and writing utensils

- 1. Assign each student a letter of the alphabet.
- Explain to students that they will watch a video and will need to summarize something learned using the assigned letter to begin their sentence.
- 3. The first time the video is played, do not allow students to take notes. This will allow them to focus on the big idea.
- 4. Replay the video a second time, stopping frequently to allow students time to take notes.
- 5. Provide students a few minutes to use their notes to craft their summary statements. Scaffold by allowing them to work in small groups or pairs.
- 6. Beginning with the letter A have students share with the entire class their summarizing statement.



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This strategy allows students to write statements about the big idea, using evidence found in media. By assigning a variety of letters, students will need to think more creatively about their response, providing a more unique approach to their summary.
